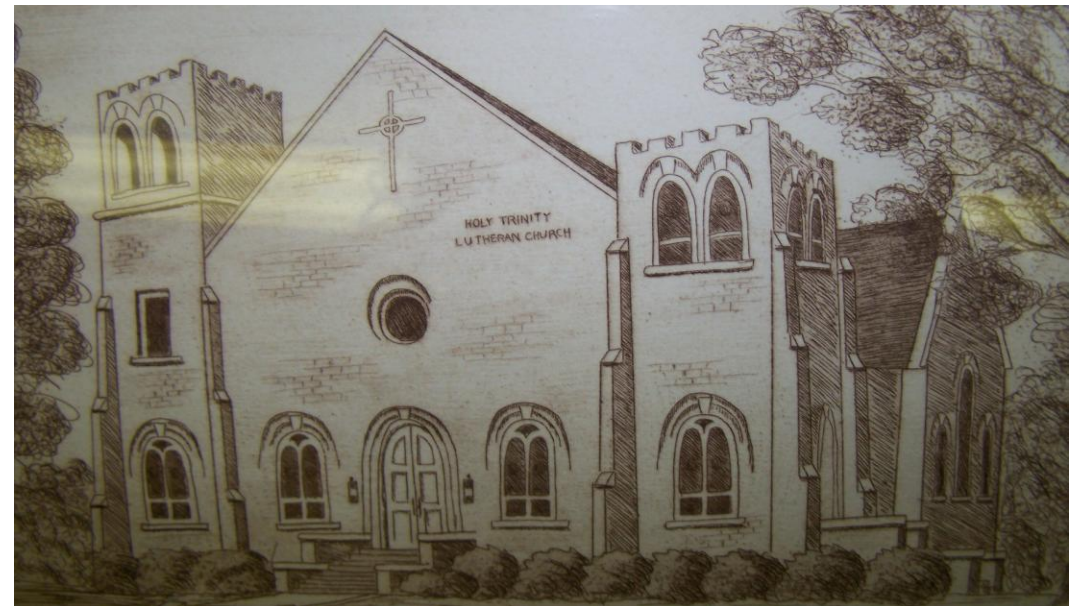

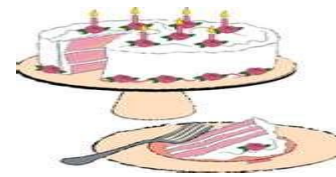

Annual Congregational Meeting Part II
December 4, 2011**

The Congregation of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church held Part II of its Annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday, December 4, 2011. A quorum was present for the meeting. The purpose of the meeting was to elect five Council Members for three-year terms running from January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2014 and adopt the Church Budget for 2012.

Prior to the runoff between five members to fill four names for the Council nominating ballot, Mr. Jeff Jefcoat respectfully requested that his name not be included in the runoff. Therefore, the remaining four completed the ten names for the nominating ballot. The nominating ballot for Council was complete with the below ten members:

There were 112 ballots cast. A runoff was necessary. After the runoff was completed the below five members were elected to a three-year term on Church Council beginning January 1, 2012.

James Wieters, Chairman of the Stewardship Finance Committee, presented the proposed Church Budget for 2012. The budget was printed in *The Herald* and copies were available at the meeting. A vote was then taken on the proposed budget. There were 103 ballots cast with 92 votes approving the church budget and 11 votes disapproving of the budget.

**Holy Trinity Lutheran Church
Congregational Council Minutes
November 13, 2011**

The Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Council met in regular session on November 13, 2011. There were 15 members present. Arte Livingston was excused. Charles Everett Frick had devotions and Frank Lake will have devotions at the next scheduled council meeting. Pastor Suhr chaired the meeting.

A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the minutes of the October 9, 2011 regular council meeting with one addition. Donna Fulmer is also directing the Children's Christmas Program on December 18, 2011 along with Lib Boland and Judi Wessinger.

Treasurer's Report

The Treasurer's report was presented for October 2011 with the following balances:

General Fund 10/31/11	\$ 20,445.59
Money Market 10/31/11	\$ 9,080.90
Building Fund 10/31/11	\$121,812.83
Special Fund 10/31/11*	\$ 18,216.36

* The Special Fund includes \$8,498.00 for the Organ Fund. Expenditures from the Special Fund include \$4,800 for painting done at the church.

A budget vs. actual comparison through the 3rd quarter shows receipts are \$1,100 less each month than what has been budgeted. A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the monthly Treasurer's report as information.

Pastor's Report

The Pastor's report was presented. A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept this monthly report as information. Pastor will be on vacation November 20 & November 27, 2011. Pastor John Derrick will worship with us November 20th and Pastor Pierce Evans will worship with us on November 27th.

Unfinished Business

- The new distribution methods for *The Herald* newsletter have been implemented with the November issue. Only 40 Heralds were mailed versus 264 previously mailed.
- A motion was made, seconded and approved to have one Christmas Eve Service with Communion at 4:00 pm on December 24, 2011.

New Business

- The December Council Meeting will take place on December 18, 2011 at 8:15 am instead of December 11, 2011. The newly elected Council Members are invited to attend and will be installed during Worship Service on December 18, 2011.
- A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the 2012 Church Budget as submitted by the Stewardship Finance Committee. The proposed budget is approximately \$9,000 less than the 2011 budget. The Stewardship Finance Committee was able to incorporate all committee requests. The Church Grounds/Property Committee will review the custodial services.
- Andrew Waters presented a framed plaque with donor names and memorials/honorariums for the Prayer Garden.
- The Cemetery Committee has requested clarification to the Bylaws for cemetery plots. The price per square for members of Holy Trinity is \$125 per site (measuring 3 x 9) which includes Perpetual care. The Committee is also requesting that vaults be used for burial. This is a request and not a requirement. A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the clarification of charges for 3 x 9 plots and the request that vaults be used, though not required.
- Ashlyn Suhr Cox has submitted a letter of transfer to Providence Lutheran Church in Lexington, SC. William, Anne, Taylor and Andrea Dunton have submitted a letter of transfer to Chapin Baptist Church, Chapin SC.
- A motion was made, seconded and approved to show our appreciation with the following Christmas bonuses:
 - Pastor Suhr = \$500
 - Lib Boland, Donna Fulmer, Judi Wessinger, Organists = \$400 each
 - Debi Barker, Administrative Asst = \$150

Committee Reports

Christian Ed: Children's Christmas Program will be held on December 18, 2011 with Lib Boland, Donna Fulmer and Judi Wessinger directing the program this year.

Grounds & Property: The following items were noted:

- The painting at the church has been completed.
- The glass that was ordered for the broken windows has arrived and will be placed in the windows.

- The committee will review the church's custodial services.

Evangelism: A meeting was held and new member baskets will be prepared and delivered in the New Year.

Facilities Expansion/Fundraising: Recent fundraising efforts collected \$5,200 from the Bazaar, \$2,000 from the German Meal and \$250 from Trunk or Treat. Next year the Social Ministry Committee will coordinate the Trunk or Treat.

Stewardship Finance: James Wieters, Committee Chairman, will present the 2012 Church Budget to the congregation at Part II of the Congregational Meeting on December 4, 2011.

Preschool: Currently, there are 39 students enrolled. The preschool will break-even financially for the 2011 year. The committee is working on the Preschool Christmas Program.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

**Holy Trinity Lutheran Church
Special Congregational Meeting
November 13, 2011**

The Congregation of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church held a Special Congregational Meeting on November 13, 2011 after the Worship Service. The meeting was held in the Trinity Life Center. The purpose of the meeting was to vote on the resolution to leave the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) and vote on the resolution to join the North American Lutheran Church (NALC). A letter was sent to voting members of the Congregation on September 27, 2011 notifying them of the meeting. Both resolutions were attached to the letter. Notices of the meeting were included in *The Herald* and the weekly church bulletins. Notification of the meeting along with copies of the resolutions was also sent to SC ELCA Synod Bishop Herman Yoos on September 27, 2011. Council Vice Chairman, Maxton King, presided over the meeting. Pastor Virginia

Aesbischer was present on behalf of the SC ELCA Synod. Pastor Aesbischer was available to assist in procedural matters pertaining to the meeting. Copies of both resolutions were available at the meeting.

As of the meeting date, Holy Trinity had 298 voting members with 60 voting members constituting a quorum. There were 175 voting members present and signed in for the meeting.

Maxton King went over the rules and order for the meeting and requested a hand vote of those in agreement of the rules and order. There were 154 members that agreed with the rules and order for the meeting.

Resolution #1, the Resolution to terminate Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Affiliation with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, was presented by Council Secretary, Sheri Wicker. A motion was made and seconded that the members of Holy Trinity accept this resolution to dissolve affiliation with the ELCA. The floor was then open to debate and discussion. There was one speaker in favor of the resolution and one speaker against the resolution. With no other speakers requesting debate or discussion, Maxton King asked for a hand vote to close the question/debate. There were 161 members that agreed to close the question/debate and move to take the vote. Members were given ballots after verification against the voting member sign-in sheets. The voting results by written ballot on Resolution #1 were:

175 ballots were voted with 2/3 majority totaling 117 votes. There were no invalid ballots.

Yes, leave the ELCA	=	139 votes
No, do not leave the ELCA	=	33 votes
Abstain	=	3 votes

Pastor Virginia Aesbischer helped oversee the tabulation process and assisted in certifying the vote. Resolution #1 was approved.

Resolution #2, the Resolution to affiliate Holy Trinity Lutheran Church with the North American Lutheran Church (NALC), was presented by Council Secretary, Sheri Wicker. A motion was made and seconded that the members of Holy Trinity accept this resolution to affiliate with the NALC. One clarification was needed to this resolution. This resolution will not become “effective” until the outcome of the second vote to leave the ELCA is taken at least 90 days from this date. The second vote to leave the ELCA must also pass with a 2/3 majority vote of voting members present at that meeting. Therefore, the last paragraph of the Resolution to affiliate Holy Trinity Lutheran Church with the North American Lutheran Church was changed as follows:

RESOLVED, that Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, in Little Mountain, South Carolina, hereby requests to be received into the membership in the North American Lutheran Church by virtue of a vote taken as of this date, November 13, 2011 to become effective pending the acceptance of a second vote to terminate affiliation with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

The floor was then open to debate and discussion. There were no speakers requesting debate or discussion. Maxton King asked for a hand vote to close the question/debate. There were 171 members that agreed to close the question/debate and move to take the vote. Members were given ballots after verification against the voting member sign-in sheets. The voting results by written ballot on Resolution #2 were:

172 ballots were voted with 2/3 majority totaling 115 votes. There were no invalid ballots.

Yes, join the NALC	=	139 votes
No, do not join the NALC at this time	=	31 votes
Abstain	=	2 votes

Pastor Virginia Aesbischer helped oversee the tabulation process and assisted in certifying the vote. Resolution #2 was approved.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned with a prayer by Pastor Suhr.

Pastor's Report

The Pastor's report was presented. A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept this monthly report as information.

New Business

- The consultation process with SC ELCA Synod Bishop Herman Yoos will occur in January 2012. Pastor Virginia Aebischer will also be a part of the consultation process on behalf of the SC ELCA Synod. The consultation process is necessary due to the 1st vote taken at the November 13, 2011 Special Congregational Meeting to leave the ELCA. The consultation must occur prior to taking the 2nd vote to leave the ELCA.
- Based on the vote from the November 13, 2011 Special Congregational Meeting, a motion was made, seconded and approved that a Transition Committee be appointed. The Transition Committee will be responsible for advising Council on matters pertaining to the transition from the ELCA to the NALC if the 2nd vote from the congregation deems the transition necessary. The Committee will be made up of approximately seven members and will include the four members of the Executive Committee (Pastor, Council Vice President, Council Secretary and Treasurer) and three others appointed by the Executive Committee.

- A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the following Church Officers for 2012:
 - Joe Boland, Vice President
 - Sheri Wicker, Secretary
 - Ann Sanders, Treasurer
 - Wendy Shell, Assistant Treasurer
 - Brenda Bodie & Shannon Corley, Financial Secretaries
- A motion was made, seconded and approved to drop the church's bulk mailing rate. We are down to mailing approximately 25 issues of The Herald newsletter so the cost of the bulk mailing rate is no longer justified.
- A motion was made, seconded and approved to hang the plaque for the Prayer Garden in the Trinity Life Center. The Fellowship Hall Committee will decide the location of the plaque in the Trinity Life Center.
- The Mid Carolina Ministerial Association has again requested that Holy Trinity participate in its program for the 2012 school year. Holy Trinity has supported the program by providing transportation via the church bus to students participating in off-site bible studies. Jerry Shealy has driven the church bus and allowed the church to participate in this ministry. Council agreed that we will continue participation in this ministry contingent upon the availability of bus drivers from Holy Trinity.
- An incident occurred prior to Worship Service on December 11. Someone entered the parish building requesting assistance after most worshippers were already in the sanctuary. In an effort to maintain the safety of those present in the Nursery and other areas of the church, Council is requesting that ushers lock all parish building and Trinity Life Center doors prior to the beginning of Worship Service. Ushers are also asked to periodically walk the interior and exterior of the church, to include the parking lot, during Worship Service to ensure the safety of our members. This will require that members use codes to enter the parish building if the use of restroom or nursery facilities is necessary after the start of Worship Service.
- Many thanks to Tina & Lee Attaway and family for the donation of a projector to be used for church ministries.

- A blood drive, coordinated by Brandy Frick, will be held on December 20 from 3:00 pm – 7:00 pm in the Trinity Life Center. Many thanks to Brandy for coordinating this event for our community.
- All church committees will meet on Sunday, January 22, 2012 after Worship Service in the Trinity Life Center. A building fund fundraiser luncheon of chicken bog, prepared and donated by Renae & Larry Grooms, will be held prior to the committee meetings. A donation of \$7 per plate is requested and the meal will include chicken bog, string beans, cole slaw, roll, drink and dessert. Council will assist in preparation of the meal.

Committee Reports

Preschool: Currently, there are 37 students enrolled. The Preschool Christmas Program was held on December 12 with great attendance. The next scheduled committee meeting is January 4, 2012.

Youth: The Youth continues its monthly ministry of feeding the homeless and participating in worship services at Finley Park in Columbia. Aveleigh Presbyterian Church from Newberry is working with our Youth in providing this ministry.
